Almost every device that is purchased for communication has a video component included. For the millions of individuals dealing with disabilities we need our 9-1-1 system to be able to support them. We also need a unified safety app in all our school systems throughout the United States to serve the same purpose and provide the same support. Being able to see the situation could save valuable time, which in turn, will save lives if our system can support the technology.

System upgraded

[We the People](#) I am asking my government to create and sign a bill that will require ALL school districts; public, private, colleges or universities to have a unified system of safety using the same emergency app. This app will work the same on and off school grounds no matter where you are, allowing the users identity to be shared from the call with emergency services to alert the users emergency contacts. I am asking them to make this a law that is government regulated in all schools and school districts at any level.

Recording laws

[We the People](#) I am requesting that the government allows anyone on or off school grounds, as well college and university campuses, including students, teachers and staff, to be able to record and share any emergency situation that is taking place on or off school grounds include fights, any type of assault, or even school shootings. This can help in instances of liability and lawsuits towards the schools, as well as prevent wrongful accusations.

Storing and saving public information

[We the People](#) as calls come in the videos will have to be stored and saved. These videos can be used as evidence, for court records or training purposes for other emergency personnel. Students and staff members will not have access to any of the videos, as they will be stored off school grounds in a private and secure location within their own state. If these videos are somehow tampered with those individuals can face criminal charges, including fines and jail time.
